Missouri Lions MD-26 2025 Proposed Changes to the Constitution and By-Laws

The following propositions have been reviewed and screened and reflect amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws of the Missouri Lions MD-26. They will be submitted to the voting delegates at the Multiple District Convention on May 3, 2025.

There will be two issues on the ballot this year. These are removing the requirement for committee appointment rotations, and approval of the 2027 State Convention location in District 26-M3.

There were several housekeeping items that will be corrected and updated once any changes to the Constitution and By-Laws of the Missouri Lions MD-26 are approved in May. One notable update, in keeping with the International MD Standard Form Constitution and By-Laws, will be the addition of Global Extension Team (GET) Multiple District Coordinator which will be added as MD26 By-Laws ARTICLE III, Section 7 (c).

In addition, it was found that the Information Technology, Music, Athletic and Lions Opportunity for Youth Committee members were not specifically listed as having two year terms (MD26 Constitution, Article VIII, Section 4(a). This section will be updated to reflect these, but ONLY IF Proposition 1 does not get approved.

PROPOSITION NO. 1

A RESOLUTION TO REMOVE THE REQUIREMENT FOR APPOINTING STATE COMMITTEE MEMBERS BASED ON SPECIFIC YEARS (EVEN/ODD) BY DISTRICT, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS COMMITTEE.

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE APPROVED?

BE IT RESOLVED, that Article VIII, Section 4 (b) and (c) of the Multiple District 26 Constitution be removed and Section 4 (d) be renumbered Section 4 (b)?

PROPOSITION NO. 2

A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE SITE OF THE 2027 STATE CONVENTION.

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE APPROVED?

BE IT RESOLVED, that the proposed location for 2027 Multiple District Convention will be in District 26-M3. Missouri.

- The current Saving Sight Board of Directors (1 nomination)

To be considered for the award, nominees should meet the following criteria:

- Nominees must have made an impact in our service area (MO, KS, or IL) during 2024
- Nominees must exemplify the mission, "We change lives by saving sight."
- Nominees may be a Lions Club member or a community member
- Nominees cannot be a seated Saving Sight board member, immediate past board member, or a Saving Sight employee



Is Hosting Right for Me?

Hosting an exchange youth is guaranteed to be a rewarding experience because:

- You experience the joy of sharing your culture and customs.
- You learn about the exchange youth's customs and culture.
- You open a new world of thinking to the exchange youth.
- You make a new friend maybe a friend for life.

Expectations of a Host Family

Room and Board - You are expected to provide room and board for the youth. It is recommended that youth be roomed with youth of similar ages and similar genders. Meals should be balanced and healthy.

Transportation - Typically, you are responsible for all the youth's transportation during the exchange. Travel may include but is not limited to, transfers to and from the airport or train station, transfers to other Host Families or International Camp, transportation to and from any planned activities by you and/or the Host Club.

Financial responsibilities - Payment for cultural activities is dependent on the agreement made between you, the youth, and the Host Club. Some programs offer stipends or scholarships for participating Host Families.

Selecting an Exchange Youth - Hosting a youth is dependent upon desired age, gender, interests, and nationality and upon the availability of the youth meeting those requirements. Your local YCE Chairperson will advise you of available youth. You can learn more about the roles and expectations of a YCE Host Family by checking out the YCE Host Family Handbook! Potential Host Families must be screened by the Host Lions Club and YCE Chairperson. Availability: It is important that you make sure your family's schedule allows accommodation to spend enough quality time with the youth.



Is the YCE Program Right for Me?

- Are you ready to embark on a life-changing advanture that will open your mind and heart?
- Curious about other cultures and ways of life?
- Want to develop your skills in a second language?
- Would you like to cultivate new friendships with individuals that have different backgrounds, beliefs, and customs than you?

As a YCE exchange youth you can expect to be immersed in a unique cultural experience with Lions and Leo club members supporting your

YCE journey. Your host family will treat you as a member of the family, expecting your engagement in typical daily routines and family meals. You will participate in social activities, possibly service projects and visit cultural places of interest. You are expected to familiarize yourself with the customs, expectations, and basic language of the host country prior to your visit and have a desire to learn more.

Benefits of Participation

- Live with a family in another country and/or attend camp with other young people
- Meet people your age from around the world!
- Learn about what it means to be a Lion or Leo in another country.
- Deepen your understanding of yourself and the world around you.
- Learn how to fester peace and understanding among peoples of the world!

You can learn more about the roles and expectations of a YCE Exchange Youth by checking out the YCE Exchange Youth Handbook! Programs are available in over 30 countries on six continents.

Participant Eligibility YCE Exchange Youth must:

- Be between the eggs of 15 and 22.
- Be sponsored by a Lions Club.
- Be ready to represent your community, country, and the sponsoring Lions Club.
- Welcome the opportunity to explore the customs of enother culture!
- Provide proof of insurance (health, medical, travel) and a liability release agreement.
- Take initiative to learn the language of the host country (i.e. basic greetings and phrases).

What are the Costs? Host Lions clubs cover the costs of room and board with a host family. Exchange Youth are typically responsible for:

*Round-trip airfare *Camp Fees *Health, medical and travel insurance

"Travel decuments (such as passports and visas) "Spending money for gifts, souvenirs."

John Allen Lawrence, International Director

John A. Lawrence from Chestertown, Maryland, USA, was elected to serve a two-year term as an international director of Lions Clubs International at the association's 105th International Convention in Boston, Massachusetts, USA, July 7 through July 11, 2023.

After serving in the US Army, Director Lawrence had a career as a civil servant in the Department of Defense. During this time, he created and led a division of 120 research mathematicians and linguists. He also served as a distinguished visiting professor at the US Airforce Academy and was certified as a professional in computer science, mathematics, and education. He was also honored as a distinguished member of the Crypto-Mathematics Institute

After looking for an opportunity to give back to his community, he found his answer when his friend asked him to become a Lion. Since joining the Kent Island Lions Club in 1997, he held a number of offices within the association including multiple district council chairperson, multiple district leadership development chairperson and multiple district convention chairperson. He also served as a Regional Lions Leadership Institute coordinator, an International Convention presenter and a moderator for the USA/Canada forum. Additionally, he has served as the chairman of the Lions Vision Research Foundation to support the Wilmer Eye Institute of the Johns Hopkins Hospital.

In recognition of his service to the association, he has received numerous awards including multiple International President's Awards, International President's Leadership Awards and International President's Certificates of Appreciation. He is a an Arnall Patz Fellow and a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

In addition to his Lions activities, Director Lawrence is active in numerous professional and community organizations. He served as state coordinator of the Maryland AARP Tax-Aide program for which he received the AARP's most prestigious and visible volunteer award, the Andrus Award for Community Service. Additionally, he is a member of the County Citizens Advisory Board for a youth center and a member of the executive board of the local American Legion Post.

Director Lawrence and his partner in service, PDG Carol Schoonover, also a Lion and Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow, share four children and four grandchildren between them.
